Servanthood and Obedience

St. Paul the Apostle rightfully takes a great deal of spiritual satisfaction and fulfillment in describing himself as a servant. "Greetings from Paul, a servant of Jesus Christ, called to be an apostle and set apart to proclaim the gospel of God" Romans1:1. At the present time subservience or any kind of service or obedience and submission to spiritual authority is eyed with suspicion. The role of the servant is unfortunately regarded as an affront to human dignity. Obedience is necessary not only because without it there is disorder and chaos, but because by submitting to it, we avoid unhappiness and discontent and even assured perdition. When we attempt to erroneously imagine ourselves being in a superior position, not a servant, thinking we are like God Himself that there is no one above us and no authority to submit to and lead us. "I will not serve" are the words Satan cried out before man was even created. That is precisely what we do when we sin. We too shout, "I will not serve." It is precisely for this reason our Lord came to earth and put aright this disobedience found in the devil and communicated to the heart and soul of the first of God's creation, Adam and Eve. St. Paul says in one of his letters, "Christ emptied himself and took the form of a slave, being born in the likeness of man. He was known to be of human estate and it was thus that he humbled himself obediently accepting even death on the cross" Philippians 2: 7, 8. In the Old Covenant book of Isaiah, we further read, "Through his sufferings my servant shall justify many, and their guilt he shall bear" Isaiah 53: 11. The prophecy of the "Suffering Servant" was never properly nor fully understood by the contemporaries of Isaiah nor by their succeeding descendants, even until the time of Christ. Our Lord taught us, "The Son of man has not come to be served, but to serve, to give his life as a ransom for many" Mark10: 45. The whole life of

the Lord was completely dedicated serve his Father and the cause of our salvation. In St. John's gospel, we had reference to this, "I cannot do anything of myself. I judge as I hear and my judgment is honest because I seek not my own will, but the will of him who sent me" John 5: 30. How many times have we witnessed the sincere service in the life of a faithful shepherd, a devoted priest, but yet balk at it because it does not meet what we perceive are our needs? Because we refuse the vocation of servant, we fail to recognize it being lived in others. In the gospel of St. Luke, we further see corroborated, "What in fact is greater, he who reclines at table or he who serves the meal? Is it not he who reclines at table? Yet, I am in your midst as one who serves" Luke 22: 27. So, we can only ask you once again, permit us to be your servants of redemption. Believers have no problem in serving others. Our parish can be called an eager society of servants of the lord. We do not find it irksome or offensive, "Can I help?" "May I be of service?" should always eagerly fall from our lips as an indication and even an identification of our fundamental vocation of following Christ. It would indicate we wish to assume both the attitude and spirituality of our Lord who passes it on to St. Paul for our benefit. The Apostle to the Gentiles is eager to be the conduit for us as priests while we hope you as pious faithful take our example to heart. We say to you with the same seriousness and sincerity which St. Paul relays to us all. "Be followers of me as I am of Christ!" 1 Corinthians 4: 16. Our created nature is such that we do in fact find fulfillment and complete satisifaction in serving the legitimate needs of others for the sake of Jesus Christ, our common Saviour. In his letter to the Roman believers, St. Paul speaks of a dedicated servant whose name is Phoebe. "I commend to you our sister, Phoebe...please welcome her in the Lord, as saints should. If she needs help in anything, give it to her, for she herself has been of help to many,

including me" Romans 16: 1. Who is this Phoebe, you may ask and why is she being recognized by the illustrious Apostle? St. Paul happened to be in Corinth, apparently on his way to Rome, but some urgent matters required his presence in Jerusalem. He had not yet visited the imperial capital although he longed to meet its citizens. Being prevented from going to Rome, he wrote an important and valuable letter which begins, "Greetings from Paul, a servant of Christ Jesus..." Romans 1: 1. To deliver the message, he enlisted the gracious service of Phoebe who became for all intents and purposes, St. Paul's mail person. The least she could do was assume a serious responsibility and deliver its contents to believers there. She made littler of her privations and many hardships. She experienced a serious joy as servant of both St. Paul and the Lord. Now we are remind so many devoted souls when we read and think about Phoebe. We are thus called to servant hood whether it be the first or the second strings of an orchestra, whether we are St. Paul or Phoebe, or Mary, or Susie, or Annie or Johnny or Billy today, in our parish. What we do with our ability to serve, with our vocation of servanthood for our Lord, only He will see and know and accept our sacrificial offering, will ultimately bless us. How many times we hear of complaints about workers in a parish. "It is always the same people working for the parish, regardless what it is we do." It is also, the very same people, I assure you, who will be blessed with their families for serving the cause of Jesus Christ. It is our God who takes note of the serious and sincere effort, made without pretense or excuse, but simply in response to an opportunity to serve. In our servanthood, may our God always be pleased with all that each of us offers Him in genuine response to his first shown love to each of us!

Eternal Father, Creator of all things, we reverence your continued grace and presence in the priesthood of your only-begotten Son, now shared by him with weakness of our mortal nature. He is **Revealed** by many Names...




"... and His name shall be called ... " Isaiah 9:6.

The Holy Name of our Lord, God and Saviour was revealed by the angelic visitor. Throughout salvation history, He is referred to in a variety of ways, each of which make known more and more of the enduring love of our Heavenly Father for each of us.

Restorer

"He restores my soul. He guides me in right paths for his name's sake" Psalm 23: 3.

We wander aimlessly away from our Heavenly Father and from the path of righteousness, from following Christ beside still waters, until we gradually lose the way, lose our joy, lose the sound of His voice. But He never gives up on us. He is eager we remain intimate with Him. Regardless how many times we sin, regardless how many times we renounce Him by our actions and thoughts, regardless how often we avoid worshipping Him at the Divine Liturgy, He is eager to renew and restore us to our destined place with Him. Just as the Prodigal Son finally "came to his senses," (Luke 15: 17) so we must also recognize we are our Heavenly Father's sons. Thus, just as God's wisdom teaches us, "...a wise son makes his father glad," (Proverbs, 15: 20) so, the believer, when he strays recognizes it is only the Restorer upon Whom he can call in the sacramental Mystery of Reconciliation. No one else can restore our rightful destiny when we lose it and separate ourselves from its security. Certainly no other created thing or person can fulfill and complete us His choice creation. Only our God can satisfy our soul. Without Him we are simply caricatures of ourselves and caricatures are not destined for heaven, but the genuine human being. Our daily spiritual devotion ought be, "O gracious Restorer, bring back my wandering soul as a straying sheep, and lead me on the path of righteousness for Your Name's same."

Types of Crosses



JERUSALEM(or CRUSADER): This Cross has four small crosses between the arms, symbolizing the five wounds of Christ. It also stands for missionary work, the small crosses indicating the four corners of the earth.



MALTESE: This consists of four spearheads with points together. The eight points represent the Beatitudes (Matt. 5:3-10). This Cross is named for the island of Malta (the place where St. Paul was shipwrecked—Acts 27:14-44), since it was the headquarters of one of the Crusader group that utilized this Cross.



CROSS PATEE: This is often confused with the Maltese Cross. The former is made up of straight lines, while the Cross Patee has curved arms.



CROSS BARBEE: This Cross has ends like fish hooks, suggesting the Christians as fishers of men (Matt. 4:19).



FLEUR-DE-LIS: This is French for flower of the lily. It symbolizes the Holy Trinity.



CROSS TREFFLEE: This is another form of the Cross Botonnee, with arms of equal length, with each end formed as a trefoil.

Focusing

In your spiritual life, are you attempting to solve the right problem?

The Resurrection of Christ is the crowning point of human history and of the divine plan. We honor the Cross because of the Resurrection. If Jesus did not rise, there would be no honor of the Cross. The Resurrection of Christ was a real event. We are given in Scripture names of persons that saw the risen Christ. At the time of St. Paul and his writings it was possible to seek out those persons and verify the reality of the proclamation for oneself.

("Blessed are they who have not seen and have believed.")

Other religions can point to the place where founders are buried. Abraham is buried here and Muhammad is buried there, but all a Christian can say reiterating the words of the angel, "He is not here. He has been raised from the dead."

We bonor the myrrh-bearing women because they were the first to proclaim the Good News, "The Lord has risen, indeed, and has appeared to Simon." (Lk. 24:34). Peter, the women and the others to whom Christ revealed Himself became the foundation of the Church. The doubt that some had like Thomas prove that the resurrection was not something that the apostles created, but in fact was a reality.

ST. ANDREW: FIRST-CALLED APOSTLE

St. Andrew. While much is made of some of the Apostles, Andrew seems to have preferred the background; but a careful study of his life will reveal his great dedication to Christ and Church.

Andrew was the first of the Twelve Apostles to be selected by Our Lord. This has earned for him the title "First Called." He had initially been a disciple of St. John the Baptist, but when John pointed to Christ proclaiming: "Behold the Lamb of God," Andrew then followed Jesus and was called to be an Apostle.

One of the first things Andrew did was go to his brother, Peter, and tell him the wonderful news: "We have found the Messiah, which is the Christ." Then Andrew brought Peter to Jesus and the Lord made him an Apostle, too.

It is the missionary work of St. Andrew that deserves acknowledgement. He spread the Gospel of Christ in Asia Minor, in Greece, and along the Black Sea. He is said to have brought the Light of Christianity to ancient Byzantium, later called Constantinople. And Andrew is said to have planted the seed of the Christian Faith in Scythia – setting the Cross on a highpoint in Kiev and proclaiming: "See these bills? On these mounts shall bereafter shine forth the grace of God..."

His conversion of countless in Patras, Greece, enraged the heathen officials of the area. An official had him arrested and brought before him, but Andrew preached to him, too. Finally the death sentence was pronounced upon him. After being scourged and whipped, Andrew was tied to an X-shaped Cross and on it suffered and died for his faith in Jesus Christ. That particular shaped Cross is known by his hame to this day.
