We are a beacon on a hill with the eyes of many upon us; that beacon is the inspired Light of Christ which must shine brightly in our lives.




Meanwhile the boat, already several hundred yards out from shore, was being tossed about in the waves raised by strong headwinds...he perceived how strong the wind was...the wind died down Matthew 14: 24, 30, 32.

It happened that a bad squall blew up. The waves were breaking over the boat.... He awoke and rebuked the wind and said to the sea: "quiet, be still!"... "Who can this be that the wind and sea obey him? Mark 4: 37, 39, 41.

When Moses stretched forth his hand toward the sky, the Lord sent forth hail and peals of thunder. Lightning flashed toward the earth and the Lord rained down hail on the land of Egypt and lightning constantly flashed through the hail, such fierce hail as had never been seen in the land since Egypt became a nation Exodus 9: 23, 24.

ARE YOU SAVED?

An Orthodox Christian Perspective



If you were asked this most important question, how would you respond? Not knowing how to respond suggests indifference. Jesus calls the indifferent 'lukewarm' and warns that He will spit them out of His mouth on the Day of Judgment (Rev 3:16).

What do you need to be saved from? From damnation-eternity far removed from God's goodness. The basic fact is that death will come to each of us, but death does not mean obliteration. There is life after death-either in a perfect place where there will be no death, no sorrow, no crying, no pain (Rev 21:4), or in a place of torment (Mt 13:41-42 and Mk 9:48). God wants us all to be saved from eternal agony (2 Pet 3:9). He has prepared a place for each of us near Him (Jn 14:1-3). However, He gathers only those who want to be with Him-because they believe in Him and love Him. He has therefore given us the gift of free will, the ability to make a choice, and has established the way to His Kingdom.

God's divine plan for our salvation required that man's sins be atoned for. Jesus paid that price by laying down His perfect life for us (Jn 10:17-18). All we have to do is BELIEVE that He did that for us and is therefore our Savior. But just as Adam and Eve and all God's people were asked to prove their love through obedience, we have to PROVE our love and BELIEF by the way we live—by trying to become as much like Christ, our Savior, as we can, and by doing His work (1 Got 15:58).

THE ONLY WAY TO HEAVEN IS TO BELIEVE THAT JESUS IS THE SON OF GOD, OUR SAVIOR.

HOWEVER, AS JESUS MADE CLEAR (MT 7:21), IT IS NOT ENOUGH TO JUST SAY WE BELIEVE. WE MUST PROVE OUR BELIEF AND SHOW OUR LOVE BY TRYING TO LIVE A CHRIST-LIKE LIFE.

The Bible and the writings of the Fathers of the early Church show that salvation is a process that is simultaneously past, present and future. As Orthodox Christians we say

I WAS SAVED when Jesus died on the
Cross to pay the penalty of
death for my sins (Rom
5:6-11). Before He did this
for me, the only path to
Heaven was through perfec-

tion through the Law (Rom 4:13-15 and 7:7-8:4). An impossible feat!

because I know this. I accept I AM SAVED it. It is personal to me. I know that belief in Jesus as the Son of God and my personal Savior is the only path to Heaven and eternal life with God (Jn 14:6). I KNOW THE SECRET! However, when studying a subject such as math, a student cannot say to the teacher, "I know the secrets of math, I'm taking a passing grade!" The student must take a test given by the teacher to see whether this is so. In like manner, Christians must be tested. So, in

on to say

AM BEING

because whereas belief in Jesus is the only way to Heaven, I must prove I believe in the way established by God—by trying to become as much like Him as I can through obedience (THEOSIS) (1 Pet 2:21 and 2 Cor 3:18).

the fullness of truth we go

I WILL BE SAVED

when my life, my period of testing, is over, or at the Second Coming of Christ, whichever occurs first (Heb 9:27-28 and 1 Thess 4:13-18). At that point I must face judgment (Jn 5:26-30) because only God (through His Son on the Throne of His Glory) can judge whether I really believed. The details of my life will be judged not by whether I succeeded in one endeavor or another, but by whether I-really tried to follow the example of perfection Jesus left us (1 Cor 3:14-15). Where does God's grace fit into the picture (Eph 2:8-10)? It compensates for our shortcomings. God calls us to be perfect in imitation of Jesus to prove our faith. He requires though only that we do the best we can. His grace fills the gap, iustifies us, sanctifies us (Rom 3:23-24).

Jesus has said that if we are not (actively) for Him we are against Him (Mt. 12:30). Make or renew your commitment to Jesus now and grow in grace and in knowledge of Him (2 Pet 3:18) to prove your belief. Be able to say with confidence (for we have the "hope" of salvation (Rom 8:24)...

I AM BEING SAVED!

The way to the Kingdom contains the following steps:

1. BELIEVE

that Jesus is the Son of God and that He died to pay the penalty of death for our sins.

2. PROVE BELIEF by trying to follow Jesus' example in all things throughout our lives. The sacraments of the Church provide the basis for this life in Christ. They are tools to help us reach our goal and to strengthen us for the struggle (Mt 11:12).

3. FACE JUDGMENT where Christ will determine, from the way we lived our life; with our own treatment of others used as a standard, whether we really believed in Him and loved Him (Rom 2:1-16).

4. RECEIVE REWARD the kingdom of Eternal Joy, for those who lived the life in Christ—doing His work and showing love and belief. Eternal torment for those who rejected (or were indifferent to) salvation through Jesus (Mt 25:31-46 and Rev 3:21).

Being with those you love is ENOUGH!

m I practicing my religion sincerely?

You may feel close to God in your spiritual life right now, but you can begin to doubt yourself. You have turned to him before, only to forget him later. How can you know if your most recent conversion is sincere?

We make a huge mistake when we look at conversion as a once-in-a-lifetime turning from sin to sanctity, from the values of the world to Christ. Conversion also requires perseverance, the gradual and continual redirecting of our lives. It is like fine tuning a television picture that is already good, but could be better with a delicate turn of the knob. Ongoing conversion means steering our lives, bit by bit, closer to our heavenly Father.


Every event in our life steers us closer and forward to perfection. We are never done with the conversion process. Everything we encounter should be a turning point which inspires us to advance forward.

The grace of conversion never abates. It can continue to come at any moment. The Holy Spirit might knock on our door during a church ceremony or a serious illness.

ordinary in Conversions occur circumstances too, a meeting with a stranger, a wedding or a funeral, a visit to a church or a hospital. Simple things like putting up with an irritating neighbor or an in-law can be a moment of grace. We will be changed and further converted to the degree that we respond to our call to conversion which means change and upward growth. We can ignore the grace or we can respond totally. It is not God's initiative that is lacking. We are chased "down the nights and down the days" as described by Francis Thompson's The Hound of Heaven.


Ordinary experiences can be turning or re-turning points in our lives. Who has not denied Christ like the great St. Peter? Who does not question the Lord as did St. Thomas? But do not think that means your past "conversions" were insincere. In conversion, we always need perseverance, the ability to live out the commitment on a daily basis. Perseverance is the difference between a passing religious experience and a true turning point. Of course, God's grace and power must both begin it all the carry us through. We must call upon and depend on his help.

The grace of conversion touches us and calls us to advance in holiness even further. Our life in God is one of continued and continuing conversion. We are called upon to respond with all our heart!

Heart To Heart

Pour out your hearts before him Psalms 62: 8.

Life is so tender and sensitive. We are so fragile. Our bodies disappoint us. Our emotions overwhelm us. Sometimes all we feel like doing is crying.

No, it is true we are not depressed in a clinical sense. We are just overwhelmed by sorrow, loss, pain. Some who feel this way are elderly, vulnerable and weak. But, surprisingly, many who feel this way are young people as well. Our hearts – that mysterious center of our being – can suddenly be plunged into the depths of despair.

The Old Covenant King David speaks out of experience for the brokenhearted. He develops a marvelous description of God as our shield, our protection, our ultimate and perfect resource in time of trouble. In it we find a declaration that we should carry with us every moment: Our Lord is strong and He is loving Psalms 62: 11, 12.

God's revelation to us invites us to pour out our hearts to God, to give expression to the sentiments that overwhelm us. And the comfort our heavenly Father has for us does not consist in his writing down choice little statements about his love and power so that we, reading them, will be encouraged. Our God gives expression of his heart for us, as do we in our limitation. God's heart is full of embracing love

Heart to heart is the way it is when we in our anguish approach our God and Creator. What if bad advances to worse in our life? What can we do then? We can literally pour out our hearts to God. In our anguish we can struggle into God's presence and bring our broken heart near to his, to be revived, affirmed and strengthened and restored in his everlasting love.

Some times our broken hearts threaten to engulf our consciousness with paralyzing anguish. The pain becomes almost too much to bear. Then we realize our God was also brokenhearted over our sins and sent his only-begotten Son into the world to bear our pain and heal our separation.

We slowly come to know our God understands us, Our Lord experienced precisely what we sadly have come to know. He underwent and withstood the forces of evil and misery, then triumphed because of perseverance in love for us.


CHURCH, THE VEHICLE OF OUR SALVATION, ENTRUSTED TO OUR CARE.

THE APOSTLE MATTHIAS

ollowing the wretched betrayal of Christ by Judas, our Lord's inner circle of disciples fell to eleven. When the Apostles gathered in Jerusalem as they awaited the coming of the Holy Spirit, it is recorded that they undertook the task of selecting a successor. Peter's words concerning this are chronicled in the Book of Acts: "Of these men who have accompanied us all the time that the Lord Jesus went in and out among us, beginning from the baptism of John to that day when He was taken up from us, one of these must become a witness with us of His resurrection."

Two candidates were proposed: Joseph called Barsabas, and Matthias. Lots were cast and, through the grace of God, Matthias was chosen to be an Apostle. Little is known of the background of this holy man. In fact, there is no other reference to him in the New Testament, aside from his election! Sacred Tradition tells us that he first took Christ's Gospel to Armenia, where he was met with great opposition. Armenia would become the first country to officially adopt Christianity as its state religion some 300 years later, but the number of converts won by Matthias was relatively small.

The missionary labors of the Apostle Matthias carried him to other remote areas of the world. He visited ancient Abyssinia and eventually found his way to Ethiopia. It was here that Matthias suffered martyrdom, giving his life for the Saviour that he loved dearly.

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
