
Jesus gave him this answer: "I solemnly assure you, no one can see the reign of God unless he is born again." John 3:3.

All men have sinned and are deprived of the glory of God. Romans 3:23.



He is **Revealed** by many Names...



"...and His name shall be called..." Isaiah 9:6.

The Holy Name of our Lord, God and Saviour was revealed by the angelic visitor. Throughout salvation history, He is referred to in a variety of ways, each of which make known more and more of the enduring love of our Heavenly Father for each of us. Salvation history is replete with these descriptions.

A Sceptre

"... and a sceptre shall rise from Israel" Numbers 24: 17.

The Story Of The Praying Hands

All of us have admired the art masterpiece known as "The Praying Hands." Here is the fascinating story behind that masterful work of art. In the late fifteenth century two struggling art students, Albrecht Durer and Franz Knigstein, worked as laborers to earn money to continue their art studies. The work was long and difficult; it left them little time for their studies. Finally, they agreed to draw lots and let the loser support them both while the winner continued to study. Albrecht won. If and when he attained success, Albrecht agreed to then support Franz so that he too could finish his studies. After Albrecht achieved success, he returned to keep his bargain with Franz. He soon discovered the enormous sacrifice his friend made for him. As Franz worked at hard labor, his fingers had become twisted and stiff. His long, slender fingers and sensitive hands had been ruined for life. He could no longer manage the delicate brush strokes so necessary to execute fine works of art. In spite of the price he had paid, Franz was not bitter. He was genuinely happy his friend Albrecht attained success. One day Albrecht saw his loyal friend kneeling, his rough and gnarled hands entwined in silent prayer. Albrecht sketched his friend's hands. From this sketch he later completed a truly great masterpiece, lauded by critics. He gave it the simple, but moving title, "The Praying Hands."



THE PARABLE OF THE LOST COIN :-



1 Lost Coin


Jesus told the story of a woman who lost one coin. She had nine other coins, but she hunted through her house until she found the one lost coin.

THE ICON OF ST. JOHN THE BAPTIST

St. John the Baptist enjoys a distinction among the saints of the Church. One of the days of the week is dedicated to him. The Church observes his birth as a feastday - joining the Holy Virgin as the only saints so distinguished. But the greatest tribute to John is from Christ Himself, Who said that he is greatest "among those that are born of women . . ."

St. John is the Forerunner of Christ, that is, the one who prepared the way for the coming of the Lord. He is the Baptizer of Christ, performing this rite in the waters of the Jordan River. He is also a Martyr and Prophet, with his words echoing through the centuries: "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand . . . The axe is laid to the root of the trees: therefore every tree which brings not forth good fruit is hewn down, and cast into the fire . . . "

This finely executed icon of John graphically tells the story of his life, his ministry, and his death. He is portrayed with the wings of an Angel, not only because he was the unique messenger of God preparing the way for Christ, but also because of the sanctity and austerity of his life. He was, so to speak, an Angel in the flesh.

Clothed in an inner garment of camel's hair, John is poised in the stance of a preacher proclaiming repentance in the country about the Jordan. The rocky formations astride the Baptist represent the wilderness of Judea where he dwelt. The bush and the axe are references to his teaching. The plate with his decapitated head is a reminder of his martyrdom at the hands of King Herod. John stands facing the half-Figure of Christ (in the upper corner of the icon) for Whom the Forerunner prepared the way and Whom he pointed out to the people: "Behold the Lamb of God . . ."
