We dedicate ourselves to insuring the well-being of all people so that we may truly experience the message of Christ's salutary gospel.


We are a beacon on a hill with the eyes of many upon us; that beacon is the inspired Light of Christ which must shine brightly in our lives.






Simon Peter, the big fisherman, has a great appeal to all of us. We can get alot of encouragement from Peter as we watch him trying so hard to be a disciple, stumbling, falling down, picking himself up again, experiencing forgiveness and moving foward. Go into your imagination and put yourself in the person of Peter. What would it be like to completely change your vocation and life's work? To leave everything that was familiar and secure and take up a whole new life. Think about it, from the moment Jesus called him, Peter dropped what he was doing and followed the sacred man from Galilee. He was with Jesus when He healed the blind and the epileptics. He was with Jesus when He was Transfigured. He was with Jesus when He celebrated the first Eucharist. And even though he walked away out of fear during the crucifixion, he allowed himself to be forgiven, and become the great leader that Christ needed to carry on the mission of speading the Good News of God's unconditional love and acceptance of His people.

It was through spending time with Jesus that Peter was able to discover the true identity of Christ. It was through spending time with Jesus that Peter was able to experience the acceptance of God even though at one point in time his fear overwhelmed.

Now there is something about Peter and his relationship with Jesus that is very important to us. It goes without saying that we are not to imitate Peter for then we cease being ourselves. We can however, look at Peter's life and by seeing how God re-created him, come to a greater awareness of God's life changing power at work within ourselves.

The question we need to ask ourselves is not whether God avails His power to us, but rather do we avail ourselves to His power?



must have been a humiliating experience to be placed in the stocks for sinning and committing crime in colonial America. How many times is our Lord shown forgiving sin and curing faithful people and then seriously reminding them, "...sin no more lest worse things befall you" John 5: 14. than Far worse temporary embarrassment is eternal perdition. St. Paul reminds us in the event we conveniently forget, "When you were slaves of sin, you had freedom from justice. What benefit did you then

enjoy? Things you are now ashamed of, all of them tending toward death. But now you are freed from sin and have become slaves of God, your benefit is sanctification as you tend toward eternal life. The wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord" Romans 6: 20 -23. How fortunate and blessed is the Orthodox Christian who avails himself of the sacramental Mystery Reconciliation to hear "...neither do I condemn you, sin no more..." John 8: 11.

Prayer for Seminarians

Christ, our Saviour, we place our Seminarians in Your loving care. Help them grow in humility, meekness and prudence. Enkindle in them a burning zeal for souls. May their hearts be filled with gifts of the Holy Spirit and may they learn to know and love the Church so that they may always and everywhere think, speak and act with Her, the glorious Body of Christ. May they become exemplars of generosity of soul and detachment from the things of the world. But above all, help them to truly know, love and serve You, the Eternal High Priest, Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ, Whose priests they aspire to become. Amen.

Praying for vocations is a most important task in the life of our Church today. Your prayers will play a very important role in helping men and women hear God's call in their lives.

The gospel of St. Matthew tells us that Jesus, at the sight of the crowd following Him, was moved to pity, for they were like sheep without a shepherd. Turning to His disciples, Jesus said, "The harvest is truly great, but the laborers are few. Pray, therefore, the Lord of the harvest that he send laborers into his harvest" Matthew 9: 37, 38.

It might seem strange that we should be asked to pray to the Owner of the harvest field to send workers into His own fields. Jesus, though, is making two points here: God wants us to share in the responsibility of providing shepherds to His people and this collaboration is defined primarily in terms of intercessory prayer.

Each believer ought to feel the responsibility for fostering future leaders of the Church, dedicated to serve God's people. While it may not be possible for many to be directly involved in helping others pursue a true vocational ministry, all can and should pray for their intentions, because prayer is an invisible but essential element in the process.

This week you are asked to pray and meditate about vocations. May the merciful Lord bless you as you pray to send laborers to His vineyard!

Pray for an increase of vocations in our diocese.

Make a sacrifice or fast on certain days during the week for vocations.

Go to church during the week to pray for vocations, your parish priest and any other priests, deacons or seminarians you may know.

Read the Scriptures daily.

Pray that our God will ask your own children, grandchildren, relatives or friends to follow His Son and our God as a priest, brother, deacon or nun.

Pray for strength for all priests, brothers, deacons and nuns to persevere and grow in their vocation.

Pray for our seminarians that God will grant them the strengthening grace to continue in their preparation for the priesthood.

Invite your priest or a deacon or a seminarian you may know into your home for a visit with your family.

Write a note to a priest, a deacon, a seminarian, or a nun and thank them for the times they touched your life in a special spiritual way.

ORTHODOX LANGUAGE

Antidoron The original Greek means "instead of the gift" and represents the small pieces of blessed altar bread distributed to the faithful after the celebration of the Divine Liturgy as they venerate the hand cross prior to leaving the church. Originally it was given only to those who could not receive communion, but in time it became a practice for it to be offered to all in attendance.

Canonization The official declaration by competent Church authority that a departed Christian of attested virtue has been glorified by God as a saint, to be honored as such and worthy of imitation by faithful believers. A feast day is assigned, usually the day of entrance into eternity and a liturgical office is composed along with an icon written for veneration. Autocephalous Churches have a right to canonize saints in Orthodoxy.

Chrism Sanctified oil composed of myriad ingredients and fragrances which is prepared for consecration on Holy Thursday by heads of autonomous and autocephalous Churches for distribution to diocesan bishops who in turn make it available to parish priests for use in the sacramental Mystery of Chrismation. We receive our Holy Chrism from the Ecumenical Patriarchate.

Crozier The pastoral staff of a bishop which signifies his responsibilities as a shepherd of Christ and his authority to spiritually govern his entrusted flock.

Equal To The Apostles Spiritual honors bestowed upon particular saints such as SS. Cyril & Methodius in recognition of the extraordinary grace they received from God for their missionary work in the Church.

Excommunication A penalty or censure by which a baptized communicant is excluded from the communion and fellowship of the Church for committing and remaining obstinate and obdurate in certain serious sins. Church members excommunicate themselves personally by absence from the sacramental Mysteries contrary to Church Law.

Filioque A Latin word meaning "from the Son." Its theological reference is to the procession of the Holy Spirit from the Father and Son which is contrary to God's Revelation and beyond truth. It was added to the Creed in the West through the instigation of Charlemagne, even though, there is a cast silver plaque with the original Creed minus this addition in St. Peter's Basilica in Rome, placed there at the height of the controversy, but thereafter ignored.. This addition inserted unilaterally without benefit of an Ecumenical Council became one of the main causes of the schism between Rome and Orthodoxy.

THE ONE WHO STILLS THE STORMS OF LIFE

he Sea of Galilee is a beautiful body of water. It has long been a favorite spot for fishermen, who have been known to fill their nets with an abundant "catch." Today, it is a popular recreational area, with luxury resorts dotting its shores. But sailors beware! Fierce storms frequently form in the Sea of Galilee, and its calm, serene waters can turn deadly with little or no warning.

The Gospels tell of one such occurrence when our Lord and His Apostles were crossing over to the country of the Gergesenes. The evening sail was so peaceful that our Lord fell asleep! Suddenly, "a great tempest arose on the sea." The Apostles were in a state of panic, for their fishing boat was being tossed about and the waves were threatening to cause their vessel to capsize. It is no wonder that the Apostles cried out: "Lord, save us! We are perishing!" With a few mere words, however, Christ was able to still the waters. While Jesus chided His Apostles for their lack of faith, they marveled at the incredible power of their Master, Who controlled the winds and the sea.

Yes, this Gospel lesson points out the might of our Lord. Truly ours is an awesome God. But there is another message to this amazing tale. There are times when we find ourselves tossed about by the "sea of life." We find ourselves in situations where we appear to be terribly overmatched. Where do we go for help? Who will assist us? It is in such moments of spiritual and emotional peril that we must turn to the same Savior Who said "Be still" and caused the storm to subside. Christ can deliver us from any trial and tribulation that we face. All we need to do is cast aside our fears and show our faith in Him.
