We are a beacon on a hill with the eyes of many upon us; that beacon is the inspired Light of Christ which must shine brightly in our lives.




You, O Lord, will keep us and preserve us always from this generation Prokimenon, Resurrection Tone Five.

shall pray to the Lord that He would prosper that which they impart for ease and remedy to prolong life and make it happy.

# Sharing The Pain

...weep with them that weep Romans 12: 15.

From the painful suffering of righteous Job, and the way his friends tried to console him, we can learn a basic principle about comforting those who are going through deep trials. It is this: a comforter's ability to help is not so much his talent for using words, but rather his capacity to be sympathetic, even empathetic. That is the type of understanding Job longed for when his friends began trying to correct him for what they thought was punishment, even being ignored by God.


The need for the kind of sympathetic understanding that truly ministers to people is something that recalls for us how fearfully and wonderfully made we are in the image of God. Most people, even physician and, sometimes priests, feel inadequate in the face of real suffering. They fight back lumps in their throats, march resolutely to the hospital for visits, mumble a few cheerful and encouraging words perhaps, even share literature on what to say to the grieving and pained.

But when asked the question of patients and their families, "Who helped you in your suffering?" a strange and imprecise answer follows. The person described rarely has a smooth answer or a winsome, effervescent personality. It is someone quiet, and understanding who listens more than he talks, who does not judge or even offer much sage advice. "A sense of presence." "Someone there when I needed him." "A hand to hold, an understanding, even bewildered hug." "A shared lump in the throat."

Sometimes, in trying so hard to say the right thing, we forget that the language of feeling speaks louder than words. The apostle Paul told us to "weep with them that weep." Yes, healing others in distress must begin by sharing the pain!

We should always ask the Lord to keep us kind and merciful, with Christ always in the forefront of our mind. We can learn to feel another's difficulty and mercy to all people show. After all is not sympathy two hearts tugging at one load? Enter eagerly, if unwarily, into the dimension of the other's difficulty.

### THE ROBE OF THE THEOTOKOS

In the Orthodox Church, relics of saints are treated with great reverence and devotion. They are embedded in our holy altars and placed in the antimension entrusted to parishes by a diocesan bishop. Churches and monasteries privileged to have such sacred treasures in their possession will often provide opportunities for worshippers to view and venerate them.

The tradition behind one of the most unique of all relics - the robe of the Mother of God - is an ancient and fascinating one. During the reign of the Byzantine Emperor Leo the Great (457-474) two brothers - Galbius and Candidus - were blessed by the emperor to visit Palestine and make a pilgrimage to the holy places there. While staying in the home of an elderly woman in Nazareth, they unexpectedly made an amazing discovery: the woman's family had in their possession for generations a garment that had belonged to the Theotokos - bequeathed to a pious young maiden centuries before by the Virgin Mary herself! The brothers were told that a countless number of believers had been healed through their contact with this precious article of clothing.

Convincing the woman that the robe should be housed in a more prominent site, Galbius and Candidus took it back to Constantinople, where it was placed in a new reliquary in the Blachernae Church. In ensuing years, the veil and belt of the Theotokos also were acquired by the Church of Constantinople and were taken to the Blachernae church as well.

Through the years, Constantinople is said to have been spared from great tribulation through the power of this precious relic. The Feast of the Protection of the Mother of God (October 1/14) is based on a miraculous appearance of the Theotokos in the Blachernae church on the eve of a great battle, where she was seen extending her garment over the faithful in a "protecting" manner.

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
