May I deserve to be the channel through which others receive grace and strength, that their fullness should one day be the




joyous gift of You, the Giver. We thank You, O Lord.

Father (Feb. 'āb; Gk. πατήρ). Besides its common use in the strict sense as referring to one's immediate male an estor, the word "f." is often used in the Bible in a broader sense, e.g., of a grandfather (Gn 28,13), forefather or ancestor (Gn 15,15; Jos 24,6; etc.; Mt 3,9; 23,30; etc.), ancestral head of a people (Gn 10,21; Dt 26,5; etc.), etc. In keeping with good Greek usage Heb 11,23 uses of marepes in the sense of "parents." The term "f." is also used figuratively in many ways: as the first to introduce a cultural practice (Gn 4,30f), as the maker of something (Ib 38,28: the f. of the rain), as the benefactor or protector of someone (Jb 29,16; Ps 68,6). So also this term was used as a title of respect in adressing one's superior (1Sm 24,12), a prophet (4Kgs 6,21; cfr. 8,9), a priest (Jgs 17,10; 18,19), a counsellor (Gn 45,8), a member of the Sanhedrin (Acts 7,2; 22,1), etc. When Jesus says, "Call no one on earth your father" (Mt 23,9), He is condemning the spirit of adulation and complacency with which the great rabbis of His day were addressed as 'ābī, "my f." In the early Church the elders of the community were addressed as "f.s" (1]n 2,13f). In 2Pt 3,4 the phrase "our f.s" may refer to the earlier generation of Christians, or it may refer to the distant ancestors in the OT, as in 1Cor 10,1; cfr. Rom 4,12; Jas 2,21. God was called "F." in the OT as well as in the NT (> God III, D; Abba; Our Father).

#### PRAYER FOR A SPOUSE

Almighty God, You have given me a wife to be my helpmate, my spouse, and my spiritual companion. Help me always to be faithful and share with her our mutual aspirations and hopes, that following Your will together we may merit heaven and give You glory.

Bless us in our daily works so that we may effectively serve You and our Christian family. We ask this through Your Immaculate Daughter, Mary, the Mother of Your Son, and the spouse of the Holy Spirit. Amen.
