HAPPY ARE THE INSTRUCTED

■ "Happy" is probably not a word that you or I would use in describing those who are disciplined or instructed. However, Psalm 94:10-19 does exactly this.

- 10 Shall he who instructs nations not
chastise,
he who teaches men knowledge?
11 The LORD knows the thoughts of men,
and that they are vain.
- 12 Happy the man whom you instruct,
O LORD,
whom by your law you teach,
13 Giving him rest from evil days,
till the pit be dug for the wicked.
14 For the LORD will not cast off his
people,
nor abandon his inheritance;
15 But judgment shall again be with justice,*
and all the upright of heart shall
follow it.
- 16 Who will rise up for me against the
wicked?
Who will stand by me against the
evildoers?
17 Were not the LORD my help,
I would soon dwell in the silent
grave.
18 When I say, "My foot is slipping,"
your kindness, O LORD, sustains me;
19 When cares abound within me,
your comfort gladdens my soul.

Why do you think the psalmist uses the word "happy" to describe those who are disciplined or instructed? Have you ever been happy that the Lord disciplined you?
