

LIVING A FRUITFUL LIFE

hile going from Bethany to Jerusalem for the final time prior to His Passion, the Gospels tell us that Christ became hungry. Seeing a fig tree in the distance, He approached it, hoping to partake of some of its fruit. Finding the tree with nothing on it except leaves, our Lord responded with this stern admonition: "Let no fruit grow on you ever again." (Matthew 21:19) Immediately, the fig tree withered up and died.

This incident should serve as a vivid reminder of what our Lord expects of all of us. He has bountifully bestowed His blessings upon us in various measures, giving us all our own particular talents, skills and abilities. We must never forget, however, why God has blessed us in this manner. We, too, must "bear fruit" in a tangible way, using our God-given gifts for the benefit of everyone. The Lord certainly does not want us to selfishly concern ourselves solely with our own needs, wants and interests.

Are we truly living a fruitful life? Are we willing to labor for those around us? Remember: we must give an accounting for everything that has been given to us. In his letter to the Romans, the Apostle Paul reminds us: "Having then gifts differing according to the grace that is given us, LET US USE THEM." Indeed, our spiritual gifts must be used properly. We certainly do not want to face the wrath of the Lord one day as the unfruitful fig tree did!
