

What's In A Name?

The name of the Lord is a strong tower; the just man runs to it and is safe Proverbs 18: 10.

Most people today, unfortunately, choose names for their children in honor of family members or because they like the sound of the word, not necessarily because of its meaning. There was a time, which the Church still honors, when children were given the dignity of a Christian saint name. The meaning of a name does not have much significance any longer and from time to time we hear names attached to people that are astounding. It is doubtful parents know the meaning of some of the names they burden their children with for all eternity.

The name of God, however, bears a direct relationship to his character and it expresses his essential nature. When He announced to Moses that his name is I AM WHO AM Exodus 3: 14, a description or phrase for which the Hebrew Yahweh is a shortened form, He calls attention to his essential, changeless self-existence. Later, God "...proclaimed the name of the Lord" to Moses and said He is "...merciful and gracious, longsuffering, and abundant in goodness and truth, keeping mercy for thousands, forgiving iniquity and transgression and sin and who will by no means clear the guilty" Exodus 34: 5 – 7. To a devout Jew, the name of God meant all of that and more. God's very name conveyed an important message and reminder of the kind of relationship people might enjoy with their Creator.

In the New Covenant, our heavenly Father reveals himself through Jesus Christ, a name which means "Saviour." All that God was to his covenanted people in the Israel, He is to us now in Christ Jesus.

What is in the name of God? All that we need for life and death, for time and for eternity, for the here and now and for time to come. That is precisely why believers find it such a strong tower in which to seek protection. The name Jesus is a byword to the sinner, but heaven's password to the saint!

The Door

This term properly signifies the entrance into a house as in "...pulled Lot inside with them and closed the door..." Genesis 19: 10. It is likewise taken in a metaphorical sense because our Saviour says, "I am the door; by me if any man enters in he shall be saved" John10: 9. Thus we come to understand that Christ is the only way lost sinners may come to God and obtain salvation. He is the only way of entrance and admission both into the Church militant and Church triumphant. It is only through him that those with a true and lively faith in him, wrought in their soul by the Holy Spirit, can be communicants of the Church of God here, and most certainly communicants of the Body of Christ for eternity.

Our Lord teaches us, "Behold I stand at the door and knock..." Revelation 3: 20. He thus indicates how ardently He waits beside the heart of the sinner in gospel dispensation, inviting him to repent and turn from evil ways. There is likewise mention made of the door of mercy, or the time or season of grace. "While they went off to buy it the groom arrived and the ones who were ready went into the wedding with him. Then the door was barred" Matthew 25: 10; Luke 13: 25.

By these parabolic expressions our Saviour uses every means and intimates that there is a determinate time, wherein sinners must, if ever, accept the offer of salutary grace and salvation which if they do not ignore and allow to pass by, they will to be able to obtain of God an entrance into the kingdom of heaven. There is a time when the door of mercy, the door of freely endowed grace, the door of heaven and glory, will be shut against them.

We also read of the *door of faith*, "...they called the congregation together and related all that God had helped them accomplish and how he had opened the door of faith to the gentiles" Acts of the Apostles 14: 24. In other words, the Lord inspired the apostles and their disciples to preach to non-Jews after which they were introduced to the mysteries of Christ and believed in him. They thus became communicants of the Church and augmented its numbers.

The apostle Paul, writing to the Corinthians and telling them of the special opportunity which Almighty God afforded him in doing much good by the richness of the gospel message. He explains it this way, "A door has been opened wide for my work..." 1 Corinthians 16: 9; "...the door of opportunity was opened wide for me by the Lord" 2 Corinthians 2: 12. This very same apostle speaks of a door of utterance; that God would open to us a door of saying the right thing at the right time which would so rest on the soul and heart of the listener that they would be impelled to follow after the Lord in faith commitment and seek his salvation. "Pray for us, too, that God may provide us with an opened door to proclaim the mystery of Christ..."

To lie at the door, "...sin is a demon lurking, at the door; his urge is toward you, yet you can be his master" Genesis 4: 7; to be at the door, "Likewise when you see all these things happening, you will know that he is near, standing at your door" Matthew 24:33; to stand before the door, "The judge stands at the gate" James 5: 9, are phrases denoting that a person, upon their repentance are finally about to achieve God's forgiveness and reconciliation. They denote that a person or objective is near at hand.

Our heavenly Father promises to give his people, upon repentance, "...the valley of Achor, as a door of hope" Hosea 2: 17. Achor was a valley in he territory of Jericho and in the tribe of Benjamin, on the very entrance into the land of Canaan.

The Israelites, fatigued and discouraged with marching and encamping for forty long perilous years in the wilderness, and coming to this valley, began to entertain hopes of enjoying the long ago promised land; in allusion to this, God promises his people, through Hosea, that He would give them some beginnings of mercy and favor, as the earnest pledges of future blessings. Thus the term door is one of encouragement and expectation.

Even David, the Old Testament king has come to grasp the awesome privilege of being at the door of God's temple when he prayerfully proclaims, "O Lord of Hosts, hear my prayer, hearken O God of Jacob! I would rather be a door keeper in the house of God than dwell in the tents of the wicked" Psalms 84: 9, 11.

WISDOM! BE ATTENTIVE

The joyful message of the Resurrection was heard by the faithful women from the angel. And being freed from the ancestral curse, they boasted to the apostles: "Dead and despoiled is death, Christ our God is risen giving great mercy to the world" Troparion, Resurrection Tone Four.

O my Saviour and Redeemer, being God, You raised from the grave men who were in chains and destroyed the gates of the Abyss; being the Lord, You arose on the third day Kontakion, Resurrection Tone Four.


How great are your works, O Lord! In wisdom You have made them all Prokimenon, Resurrection Tone Four.

O Saviour, You have absolved the penalty of disobedience, committed through the tree of Eden, by willingly being nailed to the tree of the Cross. As Almighty God, You descended into the Abyss and broke asunder the bonds of death. We, therefore, venerate Your Resurrection from the dead, and joyfully cry out to You: Almighty Lord, glory to You! Vesper Hymn, Tone Four.

O Lord, Your Nativity from the Father is timeless and eternal; Your Incarnation from the Virgin is beyond the understanding of all, and beyond the expression of our words. Your descent into the Abyss and victory over death caused satan and his angels to tremble with fear. Your Resurrection on the third day brought to mankind incorruption and great mercy Vesper Hymn, Tone Four.

I have sinned against You, O Lover of mankind. May I ask forgiveness, and even more than forgiveness? Do not grant me this because of Your nature as man, but because You are more than man and higher than nature. O Saviour, beyond the laws of nature and beyond my understanding You became man. You love mankind more than the mind can grasp. Have mercy on me who have turned to You! Vesper Hymn, Tone Four.

You are glorified in the memory of Your saints, O Christ God. Through their intercession, send upon us great mercy Vesper Hymn, Tone Four.

TONE 4

We bow in worship to your life-giving cross,
 O Christ our God;

We glorify your resurrection on the third day. By it you renewed our fallen nature, Almighty Lord.

You gave us the assurance of heaven; You are gracious and the Lover of mankind.

2. Freely accepting crucifixion on the tree of the cross,

You destroyed the penalty of the tree of sin. You descended into the Abyss, Almighty Lord.

Being God, You broke the bonds of death. Therefore, we bow in worship to your resurrection;

In joy we cry out to You "Almighty Lord: glory be to You!"

3. O Lord, You shattered the gate of the Abyss; By your death you destroyed the power of death.

You freed the human race from corruption; You gave life and great mercy to the world.

4. Come, all you nations and people,
Let us praise the Savior's resurrection!
It has freed us from the bonds of the Abyss.
We have received life and incorruption:
Let us cry out:

"O Lord crucified, buried, and now risen: Save us by your resurrection, For you alone love mankind."

5. Angels and men glorify your resurrection, O Savior:

By it you have enlightened all the earth.
You redeemed us from slavery to our enemy.
Let us cry out in song:
O Savior, you are the mighty Giver of Life.
Save us by your resurrection,
For you alone love mankind.

6. You shattered the gates of the Abyss,
You broke it's bonds, O Christ our God!

We cry to you in song:
O Lord risen from the dead: glory be to You!

"O Savior and King of all, how were you stolen?

Where does your life-giving Body lie now? "An angel appeared and said to them:

"Do not cry but go proclaim the news: The Lord is risen giving us joy: He alone loves mankind."

THE EBB AND FLOW OF LIFE

Because of his willingness to confront King Ahab for his unrighteous and pagan ways, the Prophet Elijah often found himself fleeing for his life. In the First Book of Kings, we read how God sends him to the safety of the Brook Cherith, where he not only finds shelter, but food and refreshing waters. Elijah's fortunes change quickly, however, and soon that brook, which brought him much-needed relief, dries up and is utterly worthless to him. For the Prophet, joy had become despair.

How often do we see this happening in our own lives? How many times has our good fortune turned to bad almost overnight? Our once-thriving business suddenly fails . . . our high-value stocks suddenly plummet . . . the "love of our life" forsakes us. Yes, life is truly filled with "dried up brooks."

Yet we must believe that things always happen for a reason. As the old saying goes, "When God closes a door, He always opens a window somewhere." When the Brook Cherith dried up and the outlook for Elijah was at its bleakest point, we read in the First Book of Kings that the word of God came to him. God had not led him there so that he could die. No, He had other plans for him, setting Elijah on a path that would eventually take him back to the king so that he could show the power of the one true God of Israel. Elijah listened to the voice of God, and so must we. We must be receptive to what His new plan for us may be, just as Elijah was. When our world seems to be falling apart, this is precisely the time to put our trust in the Lord. When darkness engulfs us, we must seek the true Light to brighten our path. Yes, "dried up brooks" can be transformed very quickly, if we recognize the right "Source" needed to fill them!
