We dedicate ourselves to insuring the well-being of all people so that we may truly experience the message of Christ's salutary gospel.


We are a beacon on a hill with the eyes of many upon us; that beacon is the inspired Light of Christ which must shine brightly in our lives.

Anger is cruel and destructive, but it is nothing compared to jealousy Proverbs 27: 4.


Love is strong as death; jealousy is cruel as the grave Song of Solomon 8: 6.

Praise the Lord

Let everything that breathes praise the Lord Psalm 150: 6.

The father of a family relates that on a recent camping trip which the family periodically makes to various sites, his family was awakened by a chorus of chirping and melodious birds. The first few mornings they all complained about what they thought was incessant racket and suppressed the urge to yell out and scream "Be Quiet." But then, after thoughtful consideration, his wife finally reminded him of the words of David.

David provides for us an insight we often overlook. We are commanded by inspiration to praise the Lord with all of our being through music, dance and voice, our entire physical and spiritual being. The concluding verse of the Book of Psalms makes this plain "Let everything that breathes praise the Lord.

Could it be that these early-rising birds, nature's musicians are simply praising God by their imbued instinct? Does it occur to us they simply respond to in their place in creation by recognizing instinctively the joy of their being for the benefit of man? Perhaps their sometimes shrill voices are saying, "Good morning, Lord. Glory to Jesus Christ! Wake up creation, behold the glory of all things made and praise the Creator whom everything on earth reflects!"

Can each of us say that we awaken each morning praising and worshipping our God? Do the first thoughts of our mind and soul resonate with joy in being a child of God? Do we start the day thanking our heavenly Father for health, both spiritual and physical and the continued devotion of family faith response to God's first shown love? Do we actually ask him to provide for the physical necessities we will enjoy in the new day? Do we ever thank him for providing heavenly nourishment in the Eucharist for our souls? Do we think about the means He utilizes in the sacramental Mystery of Reconciliation to lighten our burden of ongoing sin and separation?

We can only imagine what our world would be like if we all were to begin each day with praise, worship and thanksgiving as we reflect on the goodness and love of our Creator God and Saviour Jesus Christ. All creation praises God; how can we join it?

Guidance

We live by faith, not by sight 2 Corinthians 5: 7.

A young woman, Alexandra suffered many problems with her sight. Finally she found a physician who could help her with her problems. Once while in the hospital, she learned a valuable lesson about trusting our heavenly Father. Following an operation, pads were placed over both her eyes. Absolutely blind, she was content to place her trust completely in the nurses to be her eyes and do everything for her.

However, as soon as one pad was removed and she regained some of her sight, she immediately wanted to do things for herself. Because she could not see very well, she often finished up in a muddle, finally having to give in to her pride and ask for help.

Alexandra says she quickly realized most of us muddle through life in much the same way. Our abilities are limited when we try to deal with problems, but because we can see a little bit, we strive to find our own way simply by ourselves. But our heavenly Father, all-seeing and all-powerful, knows the way. He longs to take us by the hand and lead us gently through difficult times and problems.

Our continuing prayerful devotion must be to remember that no matter what happens, we are always ready to call upon our heavenly Father and Creator to sustain and lead us. We are in his hands whether we realize or believe it.

Far more than any nurse can provide, the leading guidance in the grace of the Holy Spirit is all we need. Far more tender and genuinely concerned is the love of our Creator and Maker. Far more accurate in response to our need is the presence of Christ in our lives. Far more successful is the man who seeks not merely temporary earthly guidance, but the soul who seeks after continual and certain help in obtaining the salvation of our soul.

Our heavenly Father sees the road ahead and longs to lead us as we travel it.

Are you not the God ...?

O Lord, God of our fathers, are you not the God who is in heaven? 2 Chronicles 20: 6.

A pious family was facing a difficult, life-changing problem when they gathered around their dining room table to pray. They began by reading about the time King Jehoshaphat was confronted by a formidable enemy and it looked as if there was no way of escape. In his prayer, the king posed the question, "Are you not the God who is in heaven?" As the father thought about and considered that question, he felt led to begin praying by saying, "Are you not the God whose faithfulness surrounds you" Psalms 89: 8?

Next a daughter-in-law prayed, "Are you not the God who sealed the mouths of lions and spared Daniel's life" Daniel 6? One son added, "Are you not the God who fed five thousand people with five loaves of bread and two fish" Matthew 14: 13: 21? Faith was stirred and they continued around the table repeatedly as each family member recited from salvation history examples of God's intervention in the lives of people. A grand-child sang out, as does the Church, "You are the God who works miracles..."

Finally after praying and seeking mercy and a solution to their vexing problem, the family asked the Lord to intervene and manifest his will for them. Because they were inspired by the promise, "...all men have seen my glory and the miracles I worked..." Numbers 14: 22, they placed their hope in God and together sang out from the depth of their heart and soul, "It is time for you, O Lord to work" Psalms 119: 126.

Later when that family looked back on that difficult time, they were more than convinced that God is with them to provide solutions. In response to the question, "Are you not the God...?" all believers are in wholehearted agreement. Indeed, that is our God!

Daily they thank the Lord for faithfully standing with them in difficult times and praising him for God is always faithful to us.

The Human Touch

The harvest is great but the workers are few. Ask the Lord of the harvest, therefore, to send out workers into the harvest

Matthew 9: 37, 38.

Those who maintain vegetable gardens know how much weeding is necessary for healthy growth. One devotee recently purchased a tool that promised to make this job easier. At first she was delighted because she did not have to bend over so much. But while working very close to some of the plants with her new-fangled tool, she accidentally cut and broke the stems of some of them. In the end, she had to actually get down on her knees and manually pull out the weeds the old-fashioned way. At times, she was even constrained to remove her gloves which were getting in her way.

How this experience reminds us of our ongoing work in the life of the Body of Christ. There always seems to be a new opportunity to deal with various situations. But that does not substitute for our being personally involved. Worship is a prime example. Unless we are there to join in the chorus of voices praising our God with our own needed unique individual contribution, we cheat ourselves of the grace that flows into responsive souls from heaven. In trying approaches that separate us from God, we break the stems of those valued things in life which only personal participation can overcome. We must remember we are ministering to and serving the needs of other believers, even non-believers at times. People need the human touch and a kind encouraging word which necessitates our actual participating presence.

Those in need at worship have to see and experience our actual presence to feel valued and know they are not just another digit in the scheme of things. Yes, we can use the weeding tool at times, but we must recognize it will not do with the problem of weeds so close to plants and we must welcome the chance to get our hands involved, even dirty when the need arises.

Our Creator God wants to help us recognize in those around us, worthy souls so we can by our good example and concern teach them to serve as well by his grace. People need the human touch, not just the theory, but an actual implementation of it because we first remove the weeds in our lives so we can assist others in doing the same in theirs.

Life Insurance

For what does it profit a man if he shall gain the whole world and lose his own soul?

Mark 8: 36

Is your life insured? We mean your life because what the world calls "life insurance" is really "death insurance." Real life insurance, however is actually life insurance for it guarantees eternal life now and even after you die. What a commentary on the depravities of human nature that people will insure everything except their soul. Men take out life insurance, fire insurance, health and old age insurance, accident and sickness insurance and pay high premiums for it, but sadly neglect insurance for eternity.

A little boy climbed up into his father's lap one day and surprised him with the question, "Dad, is your soul insured?" "Why do you ask this question, son," the father asked. "Daddy, I heard uncle George say that you had your house, your barns, the cattle all the farm machinery insured, but he was afraid you neglected to have your soul insured and would someday lose it. Won't you get it insured, please daddy?" He did and it was very simple and inexpensive.

God's revelation to us reveals this insurance policy. It is all plain and simple with no confusing fine print. It takes care of the present, provides in addition for the future and all eternity. The benefits are described "...as a birth to hope which draws its life from the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead; a birth to an imperishable inheritance, incapable of fading or defilement, which is kept in heaven for you, who are guarded with God's power through faith; a birth to salvation which stands ready to be revealed in the last days" 1 Peter 1: 4.

In living an upright and honest life of faith response to the first shown love of Jesus Christ, eternally life is ours. Doing what the Lord asks of us is assurance of salvation. "There is cause for rejoicing here. You may for a time have to suffer the distress of many trials; but this is so that your faith which is more precious than the passing splendor of fire-tried gold, may by its genuineness lead to praise, glory and honor when Jesus Christ appears. Although you have never seen him, you love him, and without seeing you now believe in him and rejoice with inexpressible joy touched with glory because you are achieving faith's goal, your salvation. This is the salvation which the prophets carefully searched out and examined. They prophesied the divine favor that was destined to be yours" 1 Peter 6 - 10. Salvation is a spiritual life insurance policy; Jesus paid all the premiums and you receive all the benefits. He who puts his faith in it shall not be shaken" 1 Peter 2: 6.
