

"After the Sabbath, at dawn on the first day of the week, Mary Magdalene and the other Mary went to look at the tomb. There was a violent earthquake, for an angel of the Lord came down from heaven and, going to the tomb, rolled back the stone and sat on it. His appearance was like lightning, and his clothes were white as snow. The guards were so afraid of him that they shook and became like dead men. The angel said to the women, 'Do not be afraid, for I know that you are looking for Jesus, who was crucified. He is not here; he has risen, just as he said. Come and see the place where he lay. Then go quickly and tell his disciples:

"He has risen from the dead and is going ahead of you into Galilee...' Then the eleven disciples went to Galilee, to the mountain where Jesus had told them to go. When they saw him, they worshipped him; but some doubted. Then Jesus came to them and said, 'All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age." (Matthew 28:1-20)



NEVER. NEVER GIVE UP

Jesus told his disciples...that they should always pray and never give up (Luke 18:1).

"Never give up!" No doubt we have all heard this admonition time and again. It may have been advice strongly proffered. But how can one keep doing what must be done over and over, when it seems as if there are not going to be any discernible results? Our Lord's story about the persistent widow impresses with the usefulness of incessant prayer. And he makes His point by means of contrast. The widow who sought justice had no claims whatsoever on the judge. Widows in that society did not have many recognizable rights. And the judge was not one whit interested in her problems. But he gave in finally because he became weary of her incessant pleadings. And our Lord tells us it is no different when a faithful soul, committed to our Heavenly Father calls upon Him in prayer day and night. The widow was a nobody in our common understanding, but one of God's chosen believers is a somebody, a soul intrinsically important in the sight of the Lord. And each chosen one prays to God described in Psalm 103: "As high as the heavens are above the earth, so great is his love for those who fear him."

That great praying soul, St. Monica, offered intercessions and prayers for years on end for the salvation of her recalcitrant son. There is a story of a greatly devoted believer who prayed over twenty years for the conversion of his beloved friend, but the friend was never converted until the very day the prayer died! That friend attended the requiem Divine Liturgy of his praying friend with his own thanksgiving prayer in his soul. We have heard of the prayers of many saints for others which did not find fruition during their life time, but only later, as it was the will of our Heavenly Father when it pleased Him to bring it about and permit it to happen.

Our supposed discernment is not the important thing; it is that our prayers persevere in the sight of the Lord; that we trust His will as best for us, that we know and believe His will is done even when we do not recognize it and are blind to it. That is how the gift of faith provides us with the endurance and necessary commitment to remain faithful.

If we are faithful, we certainly can expect the Lord to be faithful. Even if we are not faithful, our God is faithful, but in our fidelity, we come to grasp and understand the ways of our God are not like our ways and discernments. He will never permit us to be outdone in fidelity and prayer. The more we pray, the greater we understand even when it is hard to keep on praying, we continue simply out of love for Him.

Wisdom, Be Attentive!

The noble Joseph took down your most pure body from the cross. He wrapped it in a clean shroud, and with fragrant spices, laid it in burial in a new grave. But You arose in three days, O Lord, bestowing great mercy upon the world Troparion, Sunday of the Myrrh-Bearing Women.

The angel stood by the grave and cried out to the women bearing ointment: "Ointment is for the dead, but Christ has shown himself not subject to corruption. So now cry out: 'The Lord is risen, bestowing great mercy upon the world!'" Troparion, Sunday of the Myrrh-Bearing Women.

When You descended to death, O Immortal Life, You destroyed the Abyss through the radiance of your divinity; and when You raised the dead from the depth of the earth, all the heavenly powers cried out: "O Giver of Life, Christ our God, glory to You!" Troparion, Sunday of the Myrrh-Bearing Women.

By your resurrection, O Christ God, You told the women bearing ointment to rejoice and you stilled the weeping of Eve, the first mother. You instructed the women to announce to your apostles, "The Saviour is risen from the tomb!" Kontakion, Sunday of the Myrrh-Bearing Women.

Although You descended to the grave, O Immortal One, You destroyed the power of death; You arose again as a Victor, O Christ God! You announced to the women bearing ointment, "Rejoice." You gave peace to your apostles and resurrection to the fallen Kontakion, Sundayof the Myrrh-Bearing Women.

Save your people, O Lord, and bless your inheritance Prokimenon, Sunday of the Myrrh-Bearing Women.

Receive the Body of Christ! Drink the Source of immortality! Alleluia, Alleluia, Alleluia! Communion Hymn, Sunday of the Myrrh-Bearing Women.

If it is true the entire work of creation is nothing compared to divine love, how much more is it true all the works a man can accomplish appear as nothing compared to a single act of genuine love? +++ The only kind of activity worthy of a child of God is love. +++ The sinner who knows how to love needs to learn nothing else but repentance. +++ Love is the only door that leads to the heart of God. +++ In the end, everything depends upon our love for God. +++ If all the riches granted to you through the love of God appeared before your eyes as they eventually will in eternity, you could not possibly close your heart before this love. +++ Without love for God, there can be no fulfillment for man. +++ Holiness does not consist in knowing, seeing and thinking a great deal; the great secret of holiness is to love very much. +++ Love for God alone makes life worth living. Without love everything is shallow and empty. +++ The capital sin of God's friends is they do not love enough. +++ The deeper divine love penetrates the hidden recesses of our lives, until it becomes the soul and support of our every action, the more mature and rich our lives will become.

Christ Is Risen!



Christ Is Risen! Indeed He is Risen! This is the Resurrection feast day greeting and salutation with which believers in ancient times greeted one another. The joy and love, the faith and fellowship which went into these proclamations set up a chain reaction from person to person and from congregation to congregation all over the world. They created a spiritual bond of unity within the Church and at the same time established a united front against the paganism around them by sanctifying every day life and its activities. Early Christians were not too concerned to offer intellectual arguments in proof of the Lord's Resurrection as they were not only to proclaim the fact of the Resurrection and show its effect and influence in their every day life. They saw the Resurrection as the moment of transition from sight to faith, from physical proof to interior witness and awareness. They also saw it as the triumphant fruit of Christ's victory on Great Friday. The triumph of light over darkness was won when divine love broke through human hate which had placed it on the Cross. That victory brought a fresh new dawn which henceforth could rout the powers of darkness in the heart of any man who desire the truth of light. Three gifts come from the Cross out of the empty sepulcher:

Salvation for all repentant men; the Peace of God which surpasses all understanding; and Life Eternal. No wonder they were exultant! What more important gifts are possible in this world or the next?

But what of us? Have our materialistic times succeeded in moving us to cast out faith in favor of sight? Do we put no trust in interior awareness and admit only physical proof? Or does the soft radiance of the Resurrection Sun cast its glowing shafts over the battlefield of our own dark nights, making it possible to see salvation and peace and eternal life in our celebration of this glorious feast? Let us repeat over and again the glorious and soul-invigorating truth. Let us make holy particular moments in greeting one another with the truth of Christ's triumph. Let us utilize the means our blessed Church offers us in the hallowed tradition of our spiritual forbears. Let us assume it, make it our own and evangelically boast in the victory of our God. Let us spread the message of its elementary truth. Let us joyfully repeat it for our own benefit and that of others. Let us constantly affirm our belief in the eternal truth of Christ's Resurrection. Let us then live the Resurrection truth. Let us not fail to greet one another with the warm and fraternal greeting: Christ Is Risen! to which we should zealously respond: Indeed He Is Risen!

Mother's Influence

"I find myself thinking of your sincere faith, faith which first belonged to your grandmother and to your mother" 2 Timothy 1:5. Godly and faithful parents leave an unforgettable impression other families. This is often evidenced by the genuine love and healthy respect they receive from their devoted children. Take for example, the thoughtfulness William McKinley showed his mother. He kept in touch with her every day. When he did not see her, he wrote or telegraphed. When she became ill, he arranged to have a special train standing by at full steam, ready to take him to her bedside. Then one night, she did call for him. Immediately, he wired, "Tell Mother I will be there." His mother died in the comforting arms of her son. It was her gentle, faithful, believing virtue that helped mold the President's character, for when he was gunned down some four years later in Buffalo, NY, he showed no bitterness or animosity towards his assassin. It was with deeply imbued courage that he said, "God's will be done." Before he died, he asked to hear once again an old spiritual which has mother taught him as a child.

Those who have been blessed with a heritage in Christ, communicants of His Body, the Church, remember fondly the faith commitment of their mothers, particularly as we join in the national honors being accorded them today. If you have strayed from the principles taught by your mother, return to them so as to honor her. Honor her by confessing your sin and returning to Christ! Let the precious memories of the precious mother in your life, who all these years has been pointing you in the direction of the Lord, awaken in your heart and soul a new desire to live for Him, to be faithful once again to Him. Today, particularly, do not turn your back on the Godly influence of a good mother.

There is no better or greater, or more respectable way to honor our mothers today than to reaffirm the Godly principles we learned from them. It is our mother that introduced us to the truth and love of Christ. It is our mother who nourished is child-like faith in us until we matured and grew up. We must all ask ourselves, has our faith also matured and grown as befits an adult believer. Has the seed of faith, planted in our heart and soul been permitted to drop deep roots in the core of our being? Does it influence our daily course of life? Has it improved us so that we are pleasing in the sight of the Lord? Have we so tended it that we are even more faithful today than when we had the benefit of mother's presence in lives?

Remain faithful to the Lord in His Church and you will have redeemed yourself while at the same time honoring your mother while glorifying Christ!

An Old Fashioned Woman?

The description, "...worthy wife..." Proverbs 19:14, reminds us of the tintype we often see in a pioneer display, the seldom smiling woman, strong of back and arm, swathed and aproned in calico and booted in high buckled shoes, standing tall beside her bearded husband, surrounded by a brood of cleanly clothed children. Many

times our reaction to such a sight has already been cue-carded by the so-called modern advertisement: "You've come a long way baby!"

But for the believer, the picture drawn for us by the Revelation of the Lord is a beautifully appealing one, a picture of a gracious wife and mother who practices and is not ashamed of her love for our Heavenly Father and her husband and family in the state of life to which our Heavenly Father has called and placed her. One can only pray and hope that the current fad of pagan elements in the women's lib movement have not rendered this picture of a devoted mother obsolete.

But is it at worst obsolete or at best old-fashioned to suggest that this selection of the Old Testament's tribute to a hard working wife and mother still has significant meaning at the present time? Even though calico has been replaced by the expendable polyester and high buckle shoes by sharp pointed foot covering, the woman beneath the apron and the shoes remains a woman of God, created in His image and brought to perfection in His likeness by the sacramental Mysteries of the Lord in the life of His Body, the Church.

May the husband of every wife and mother declare openly and publicly as well as privately that a worthy wife and mother is indeed more valuable than pearls. And in so doing, he shows himself knowing and understanding then the intent of the writer of the Book of Proverbs: "And have joy of the wife of your youth, your lovely hind, your graceful doe. Her love will invigorate you always, through her love will flourish ontinually. When you lie down she will watch over you, and when you wake she will share your concerns; wherever you turn, she will guide you. Why, then my son, should you go astray for another's wife, and accept the embraces of an adulteress" Proverbs 5:18-20?

or he who has found one such pearl of great value knows that it was worthwhile to go and sell all that he had obtain that treasure. "When he found one really valuable pearl, he went back and put up for sale all that he ad and bought it" Matthew 13:46.

the fortunate man who has entrusted his whole heart, soul and complete self to his beloved has found "...a uried treasure..." Matthew 13:44, in her love and loyalty. Knowing from the very beginning that it is not good "...that man should be alone..." Genesis 2:18, that same man rejoices in God that his helper, his partner, and co-creator with God, "...brings him good, not evil, all the days of her life" Proverbs 31:13.

he skillful hands of today's woman have gone far beyond "...making cloth..." Proverbs 31:13, or "...plying to spindle..." Proverbs 13:19.

oday's woman of faith deserves much more recognition because remaining faithful to the Lord is a greater arden and responsibility. Her strong and gentle fingers are now making peace out of strife, justice out of scrimination, wisdom out of ignorance, joy out of sadness, health out of sickness, a family out of disparate embers, and providing loving, caring service wherever there is evident need. Her arms are simultaneously nort enough to embrace heartily and warmly and support those closest to her as well as long and strong tough to "...reach out her hands to the poor and extend her arms to the needy" Proverbs 31:20.

is no wonder, then, that Solomon, the inspired writer of the God's Word addresses the worthy wife and other and rightly insists "...fine linen and purple are her clothing" Proverbs 31:22.

omen's beauty and depth do not depend upon make-up, vanishing cream, or the latest slacks or sacks from ks. The understanding and acceptance in her eyes, the truth and tenderness upon her lips, the faith, hope, and love in her heart make her eternally attractive. Her dignity and her confidence come from the Lord Who created her in His image in paradise itself.

How Solomon addresses salutes the Mother of God, who was yet to come in salvation history, as depicted on the Royal Doors of many an icon screen, he also utters identical words to a worthy wife and mother today: "Many are the woman who have done admirable things, but you have surpassed them all" Proverbs 31:29.

The labors of a woman, particularly her present pangs of pain in bringing new life in cooperation with the grace of the Holy Spirit, not only in the flesh of another created being, but to a new freedom of equality that will make it unnecessary for her to bury her myriad and varied talents out of fear or frustration from an ignorant or domineering husband who is not worthy of his vocation. Every labor a mother performs reminds all women of the world that every daughter of Eve remains "...a mother of all the living" Genesis 3:20, and never an enemy of life. A woman's rich reward for waiting while men discovered that alone they could name all things except their own personal fulfillment and completion to be finally lovingly accepted as helpmate and partner, on equal footing with man because of the very will of the Eternal Father Himself.

Our women, our wives, our mothers, as old-fashioned as the very world itself, have surely come a long way, particularly when they associate themselves with the grace of the Holy Spirit and salvation in Christ. Theirs has never been an easy way, nor an easy lot. Many times abused, it was the Lord Himself Who raised their inherent dignity and placed it in its correct eternal perspective. It was He Who came into the world, in His fullest humanity without the aid or assistance of an earthly man or father, but solely with the complete cooperation and submission of just one woman, one mother, who continues to remain for every woman, every wife, every mother, the Way, the Life, and the eternal Truth.

As our nation salutes its Mothers, we enthusiastically join to honor these saints among us. We pray their joy will be fulfilled in this life as well as in the next. We pray the Lord continues to impart to our mothers His choicest grace and benediction, that in good physical and spiritual health, they may continue to enjoy the love of their husbands, their children, and be worthy of the respect of their friends and admirers now and for all time. May the good and gracious Lord continue to grant them Many and Blessed Years, Christ Is Risen!

"DO YOU NOT KNOW THAT YOU ARE THE TEMPLE OF GOD ..."

ach year, the 3rd Sunday of Pascha finds our Holy Orthodox Church commemorating the MYRRH-BEARING WOMEN. These brave souls, who had followed Christ throughout His earthly ministry, were so committed to serving their Master that they were willing to challenge the authority of Rome and risk their very lives to carry out an important aspect of their Jewish tradition: the proper preparation of a body for burial.

Have you ever wondered why the Myrrh-bearers felt that this was so essential? For the Jews, the human body was considered to be a sacred vessel that needed to be treated with care - even after death. The Old Testament is filled with stories that exhibit this type of treatment for those who have departed this life. The prescribed ritual of anointing a body with oils and spices was a lengthy and costly process - the women had to return to the tomb early on "the first day of the week" because Joseph of Arimathea and

Nicodemus, who claimed Christ's Body from Pilate, lacked the time to complete their labors as sunset approached on that first Great and Holy Friday.

In a Christian context, the body is treated with the same reverence. In his first letter to the Corinthians, the Apostle Paul poses this question: "Do you not know that you are the temple of God and that the Spirit of God dwells in you?" (1 Cor. 3:16) While this verse has a broad meaning relating to the unity of the entire Church, it nonetheless is viewed as comparing our bodies to a "temple" that should be cared for in a special way. This is why the Orthodox Church continues to expressly forbid cremation, maintaining this practice would be a desecration of something sacred.

From the day of our baptism, when we "put on Christ," the Lord wishes to dwell in all of us. May we all strive to keep our "temple" pure, so that the living God will be able to be a positive force in our lives!
