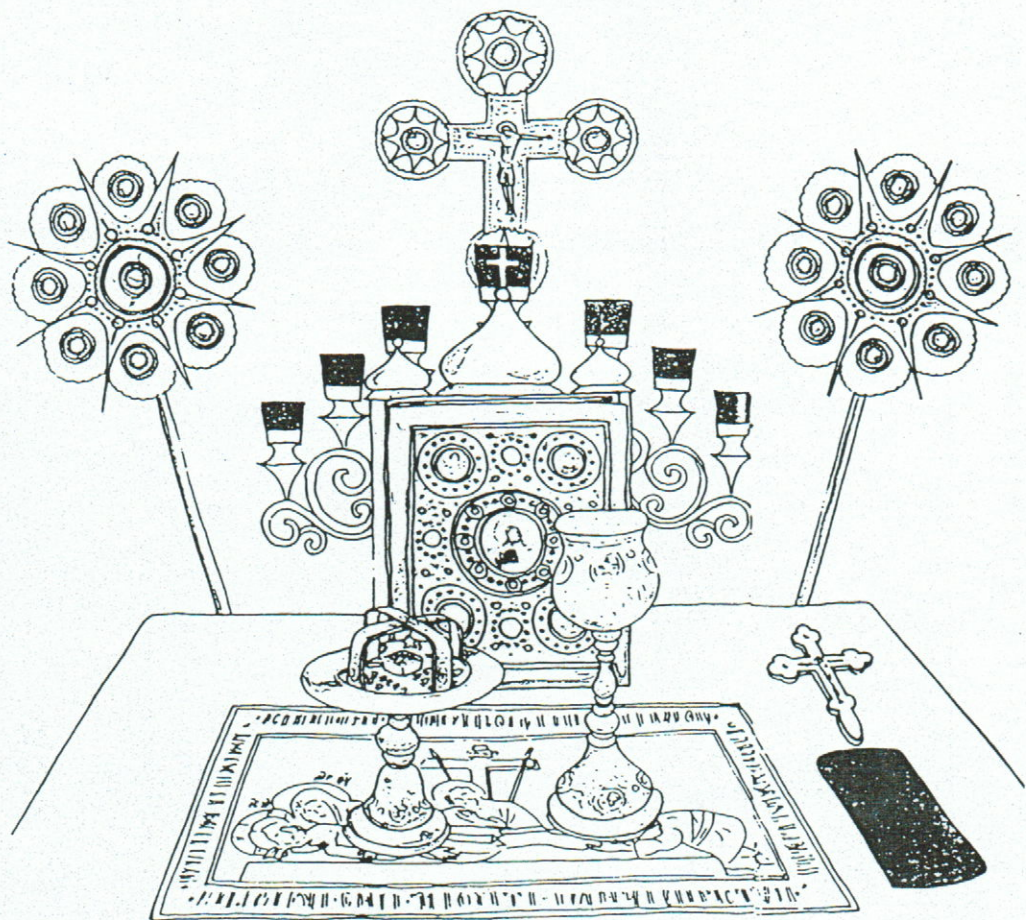
Jesus asked His listeners, "Which of these men was a good neighbor?"
