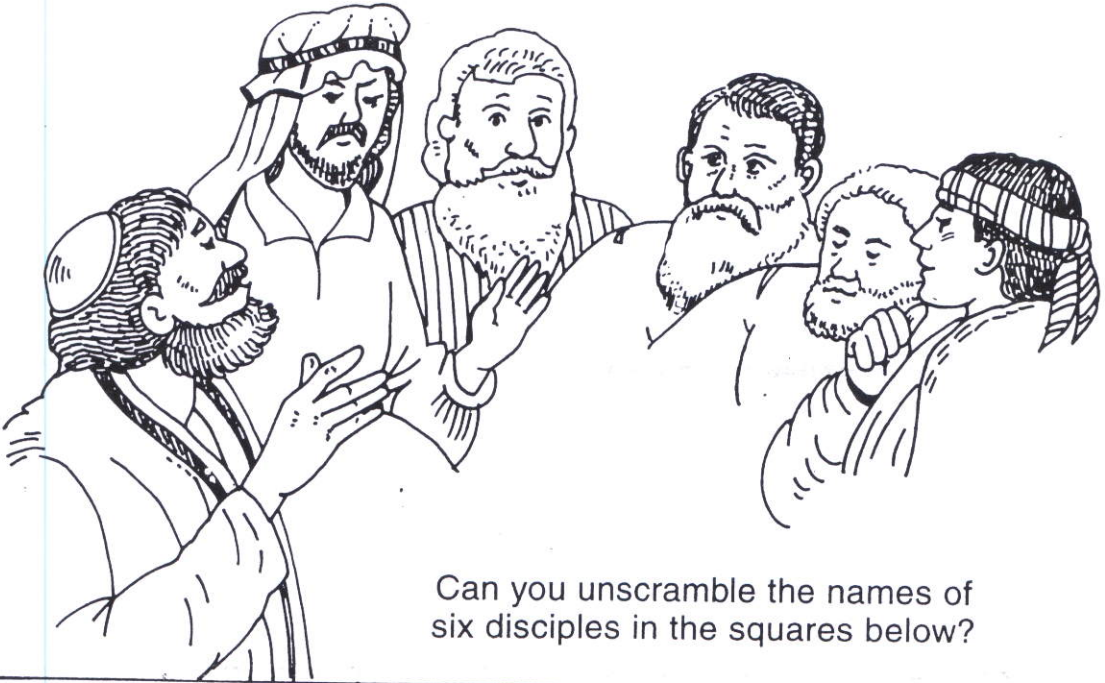


THE DISCIPLES
