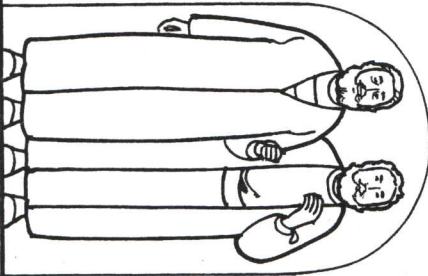

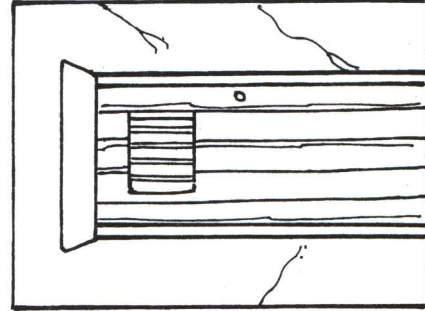
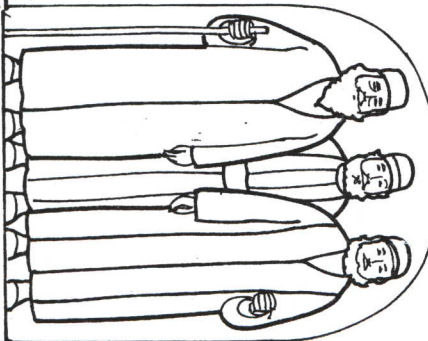
copies of the Speak Boldly Stand-up Figures for each child

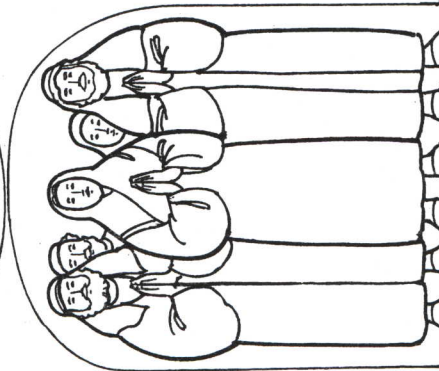
Directions

Color and cut out each figure. Fold the bases of each figure along the dotted lines so that the figures stand up. Use the figures to retell the story of Peter and John speaking boldly:

- 1) Peter and John were speaking to some people about Jesus (show Peter and John).
- 2) The priests, the captain of the temple guard, and the Sadducees were upset with Peter and John for talking about Jesus rising from the dead (show the three men).



- 3) Peter and John were put in prison (show the prison door).
- 4) The rulers told Peter and John not to speak about Jesus anymore, but Peter and John said they would obey God and not men (show the three men and Peter and John).
- 5) After Peter and John were released, the believers prayed (show the group of believers praying).

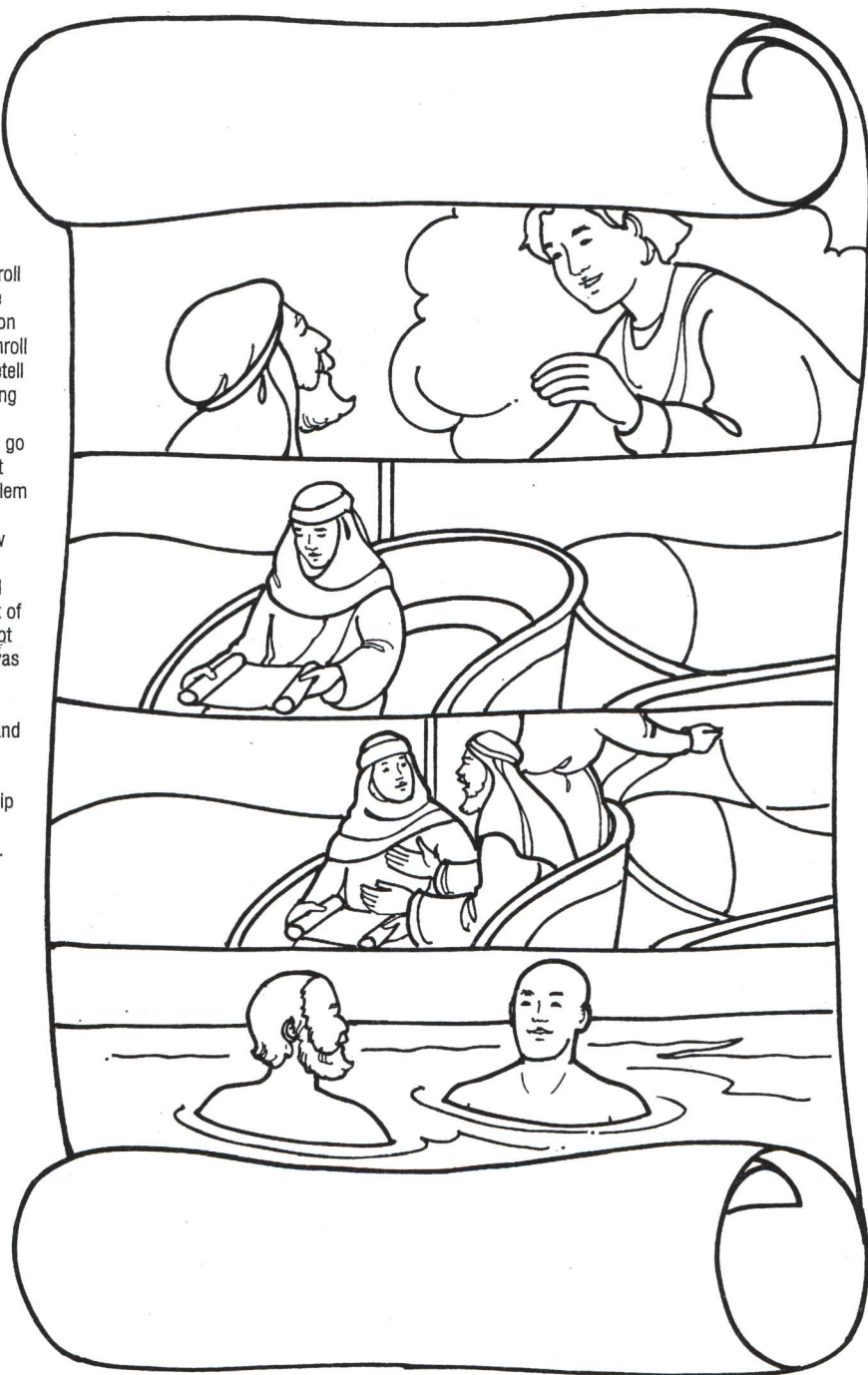

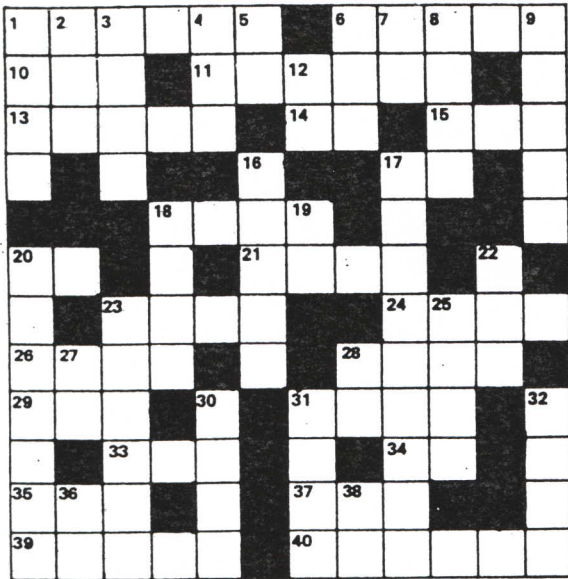

- 2) On his way, Philip saw an Ethiopian who was sitting in a chariot and reading from the book of Isaiah. The man did not understand what he was reading.
- 3) Philip explained the Scripture to the man and told him about Jesus.
- 4) The Ethiopian wanted to be baptized, so Philip baptized him in some water that was nearby.

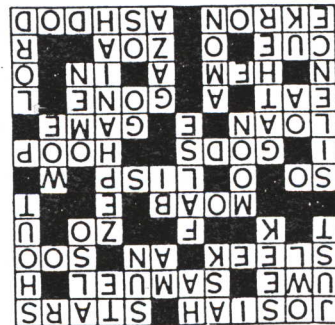
