


## **Directions**

Attach the two sides of the maze by taping them together at the seam. Color the towns and the people in the maze. Use the maze to retell the story of Jesus and the 10 men with leprosy:

- Jesus was traveling to Jerusalem. As He was entering a village, 10 men with leprosy called out asking for help.
  (Trace a red path from Jesus to the 10 men outside the village.)
- Jesus told the 10 men to go and show themselves to a priest, and as they went they were healed. (Trace a green path leading the 10 men from the village to the priest.)
- 3) Jesus continued on His path, and one man came back to Him and thanked Him. (Trace a red path from Jesus at the village to the place where one man is thanking Him. Trace a blue path leading one man from the group with the priest to the place where he is thanking Jesus.)
- Jesus asked the man where the rest were. He told the man who came back that it was his faith that had healed him. Jesus continued on His way. (Trace a red path from Jesus with the one man to the city of Jerusalem.)
