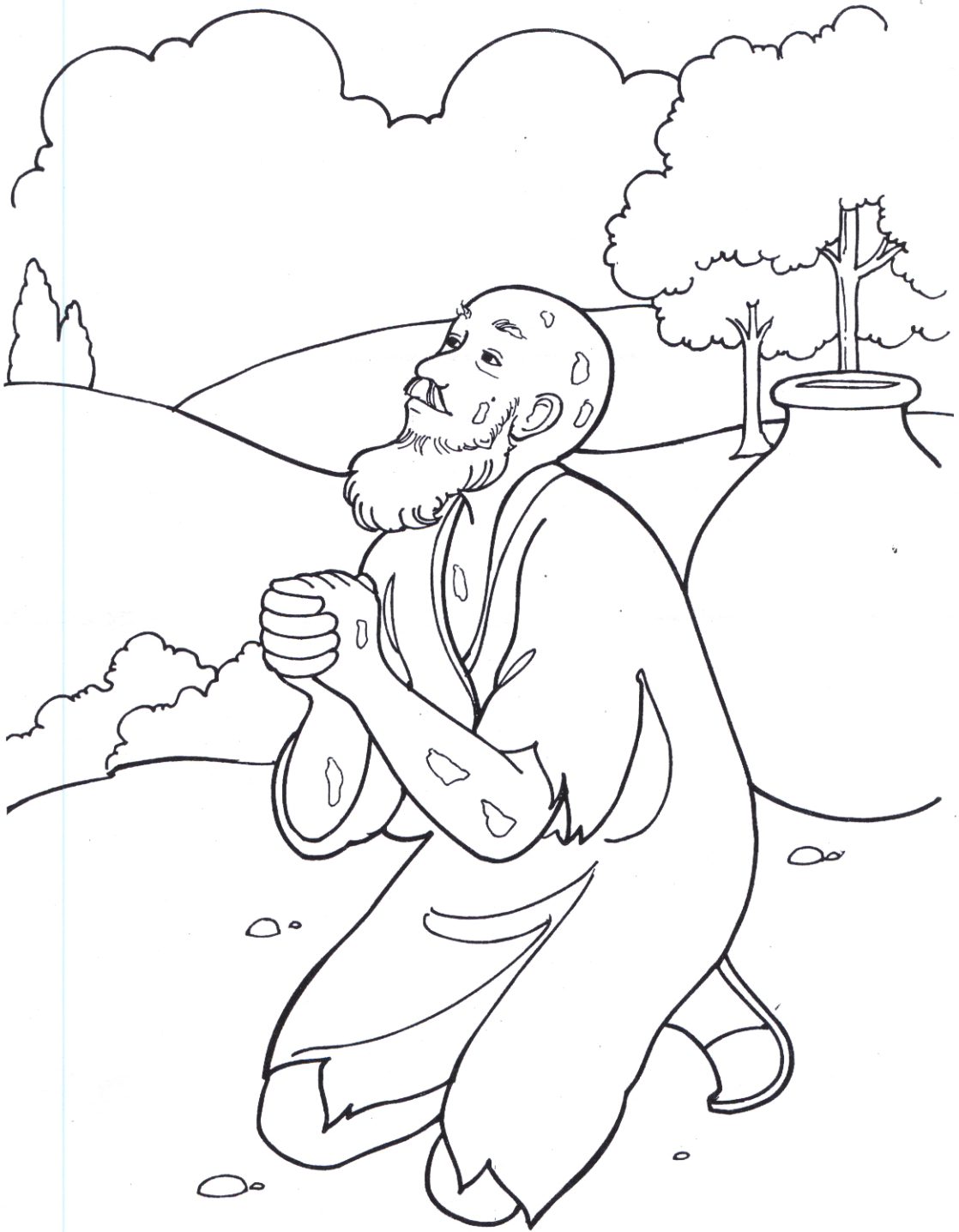

## Job 1, 2, 42—Job Does What Is Right

### Job Time Line

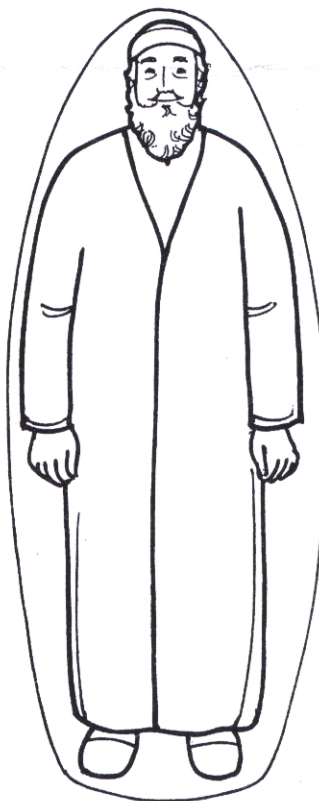
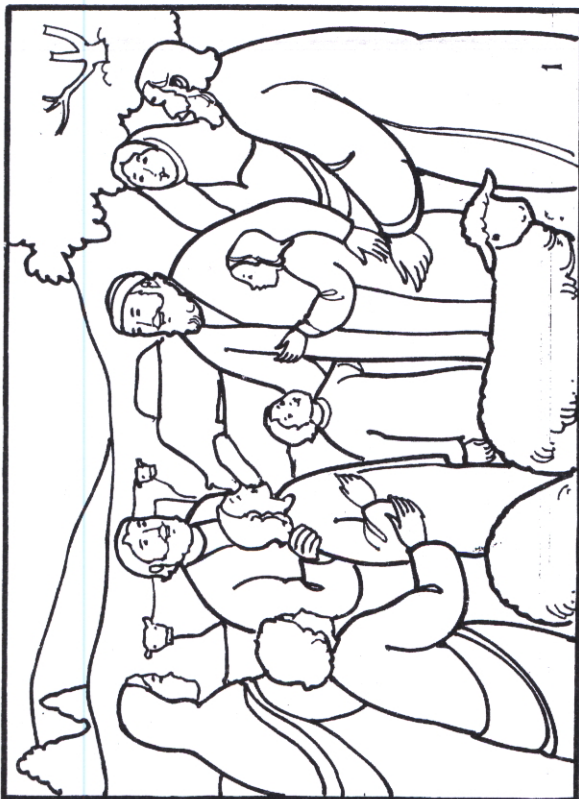
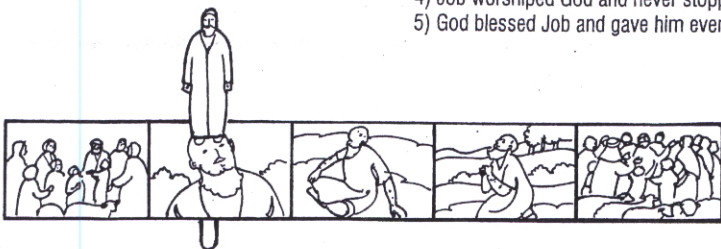
#### Supplies

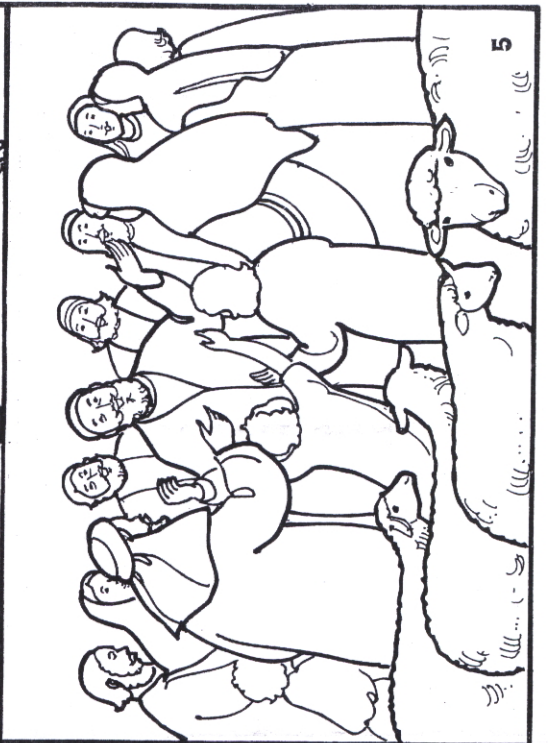
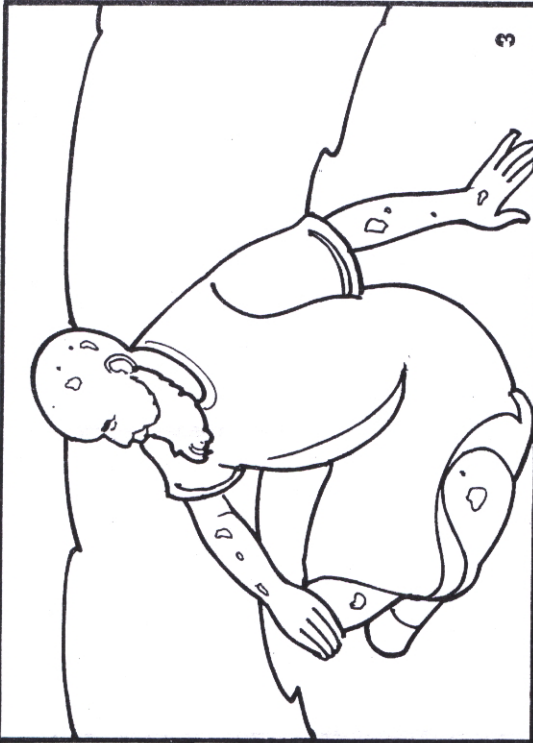
copies of the time line scenes and Job figure  
for each child  
construction paper (3 sheets per child)  
crayons or markers  
scissors  
glue

#### Directions

Color and cut out each time line scene and the Job figure. Cut two pieces of construction paper in half widthwise so that you have four halves of paper (each 9" wide and 6" tall). You will need three of these pieces for this activity. Tape three pieces of construction paper together, end to end, to form one long piece. Glue your time line scenes onto the long construction paper strip so that the ends of each scene are touching. From the extra piece of construction paper, cut a strip that is 1" wide and 12" long. Fold the last 2" of this strip down and glue the Job figure to the folded section (so that the folded part is attached at the back of Job's feet). Hook the Job figure over the top of the time line with the strip running behind the time line and move the figure along as you retell the story of Job doing what was right:

- 1) Job was happy and healthy with a large family and lots of animals.
- 2) Job lost most of his family and he was sad.
- 3) Job got sick and was miserable.
- 4) Job worshiped God and never stopped praising Him.
- 5) God blessed Job and gave him even more than he had in the beginning.
